*4.6 Oak Farm were brought in to discuss their tender, and also to discuss their new-build site near the existing site (which will be available from June). Their original tender was weak. The new site in particular will have significant advantages for the service, including capacity for bariatric cases. The provider was able to allay concerns around staffing, local support from GP practices, and other issues. Following subsequent discussion, it was agreed that the site would be suitable for all types of patients tendered for, but that the new build, where Category A patients could be placed, would need to be assessed again once the building was up.

*4.7 Greshams care home was reviewed by both evaluators. It was agreed by both parties that Greshams could be used for Category C patients, as tendered, though a formal marking was not given.

*4.8 Beeshaw is a home close to Norwich. Their tender was adequate but not comprehensive in terms of staffing. This was followed up with an email exchange with the company. The response was evaluated and it was determined that Beeshaws would be recommended for Category B and C patients, but not for Category A, which could potentially be more too demanding on the resources.

*4.9 Similarly, Fitzroy Care applied to provide services for Category B and C patients, but since there were concerns particularly around the staffing, it was determined that, initially at least, we would only use the home for Category C patients.
